 - Must not just be a 'rabble.'
 - Must have a reasonable number; can be counter-productive if small.
- AA concluded marches can be very worthwhile, if done in an organised and orderly way
- Should we have one on the same day as the FCA's Annual Public Meeting, 9th October? later decided to have a roundtable meeting instead.

7. Upcoming consultations we will respond to

- There are two that we feel we need to respond to, to speak up for the consumer interest, as consumer protections are in jeopardy:
 - HM Treasury's Consultation on Financial Ombudsman Service.
 - FCA and FOS consultation CP 25/2 on Modernising the Redress System.

- November 13th
- 'Protecting Consumer Protections; for the sake of Society and The City'
- To take place in Parliament

9. Our Strategy for Driving Change

- A continuation of recent dialogue.
- "The more you focus, the further you can go."

10. FCA Consumer Panel Vacancies

• Those working for pro-consumer organisations are not allowed to apply for any of the vacancies, as explained by this paragraph:

All applicants are required to demonstrate that they do not have other interests likely to conflict with their responsibilities as an appointment by the FCA. Any potential conflict of interest should be declared as early as possible in the selection process. As such, these positions are not suitable for those who are currently employed in FCA regulated firms, the financial regulatory family or consumer lobbying organisations.
